They were chosen as one of the 20 top teams from over 500 teams world-wide. They did not advance to the finals but were widely praised for their visionary idea and fantastic presentation. Having our kids experience this event was inspirational to all of us..." We are very proud of all of our robotics students and look forward to seeing continued involvement of more and more of our students in this wonderful learning experience.


